Random Variables

- This is a sequence of random numbers.
- Discrete
 - The values can only take on a countable number of possibilities.
- Continuous
 - The value comes from a non-countable set.

Differential Distribution Functions

- Your book calls these probability distribution functions.
- Discrete

$$p(x_i) = P(X = x_i)$$

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$$\sum_{i=1}^{\infty} p(x_i) = 1$$

Continuous

$$P(X \in [x, x + \Delta x]) = \int_{x}^{x + \Delta x} f(y) dy$$

$$\int_{x}^{\infty} f(x) dx = 1$$

$$\int_{-\infty}^{\infty} f(x) dx = 1$$

Cumulative Distribution Functions

Discrete

$$F(x) = \sum p(x_i)$$

• Continuous $\overline{x_i \le x}$

•
$$F(x)=P(X\leq x)$$
 or

$$F(x) = \int_{-\infty}^{x} f(y) dy$$

Mean or Expected Value

Discrete

•
$$E(X_i) = \mu_i = \sum_{i=1}^{\infty} p_{X_i}(x_i)$$

Continuous

$$E(X_i) = \mu_i = \int_{-\infty}^{\infty} x f_{X_i}(x) dx$$

Properties

$$E(cX) = cE(X)$$

$$E(\sum_{i=1}^{n} c_{i} X_{i}) = \sum_{i=1}^{n} c_{i} E(X_{i})$$

Median

- Discrete
 - Smallest x such that F(x)>=0.5
- Continuous
 - F(x)=0.5

Variance

- $\sigma_i^2 = E[(X_i \mu_i)^2] = E(X_i^2) \mu_i^2$
- Standard deviation is square root of variance.
- Properties

$$Var(X) \ge 0$$

$$Var(cX) = c^{2} Var(X)$$

$$Var(\sum_{i=1}^{n} X_{i}) = \sum_{i=1}^{n} Var(X_{i})$$

Covariance

- $C_{ij} = E[(X_i \mu_i)(X_j \mu_j)] = E(X_i X_j) \mu_i \mu_j$
- Measures correlation between random variables.
- Independent random variables have C_{||}=0.
- Sign tells you if they are positively of negatively correlated
- Correlation ρ_{ij} fixes units problem.

Stochastic Processes

- This is a collection of similar random variables ordered over time. Our simulation outputs can be considered to be stochastic processes.
- Covariance-stationary implies that the mean and variance don't change over time.
