A Few Words About Scripting Languages

- Basics of shell scripting are (IMO!) a useful addition to one's bag of tricks —
 not just for writing scripts you will keep, but also for interactive use.
- But if you're doing anything complicated, especially if it involves working with text, consider using a scripting language. Perl is a traditional choice (so it's useful to know some Perl, in case you need to look at / modify someone else's code) but can be "write-only". Python is said to be a good choice too!
