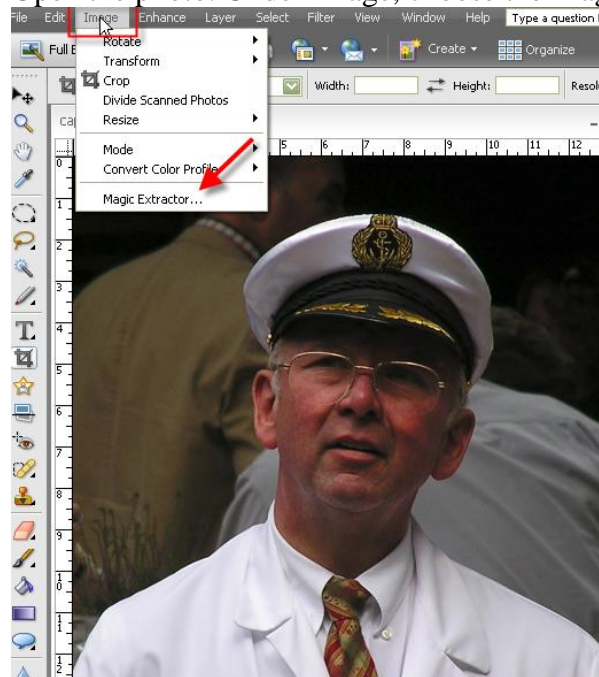


Transforming a Snapshot to a Sepia Vignette Portrait

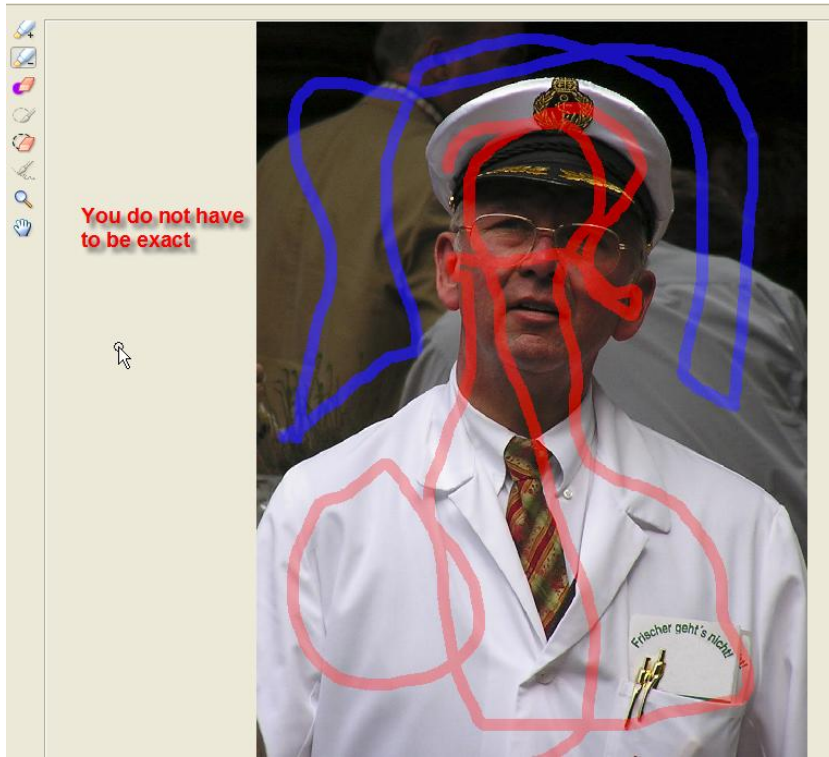

Open the photo. Under Image, choose the Magic Extractor:



Select the foreground brush first and mark what you want to keep, then select the background brush and mark what you want to get rid of:



Check preview –

or more times with the
nd Brush tool to choose
ns to exclude.

3 Press Preview to view the selection. Use
the Selection Eraser and Smoothing
Brush tools to fine-tune the selection.

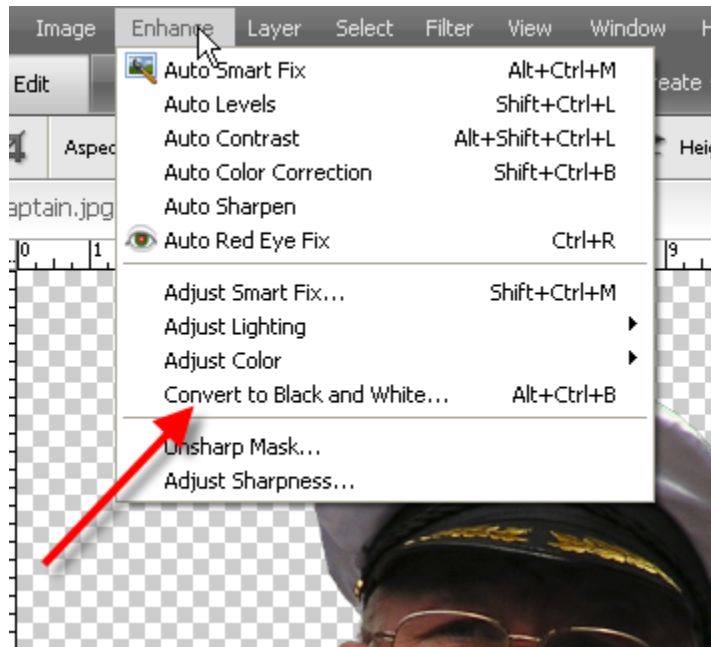

Enhance>Convert to Black and White



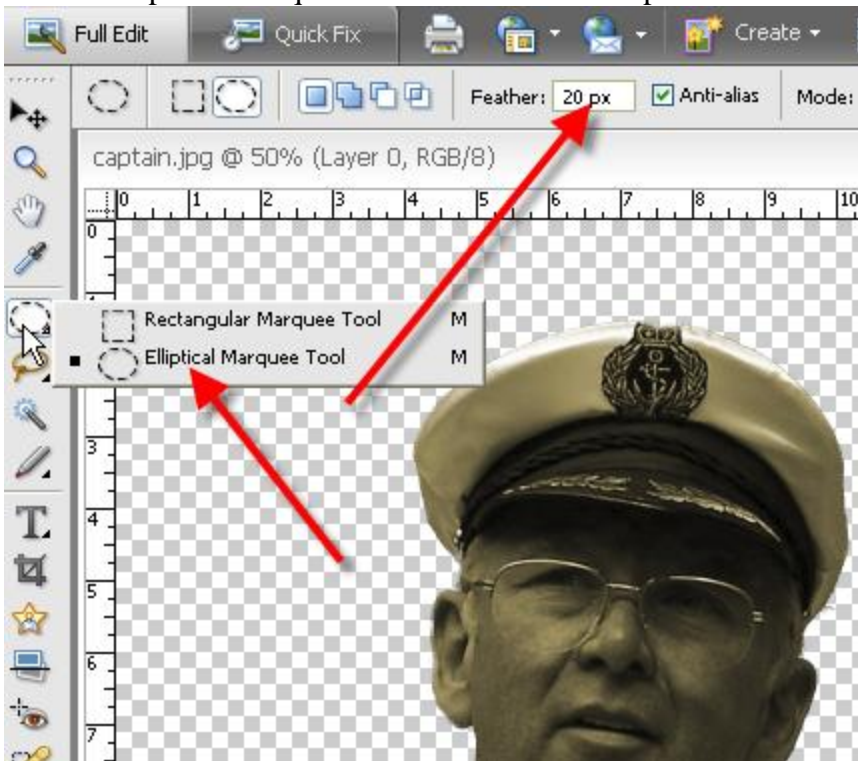

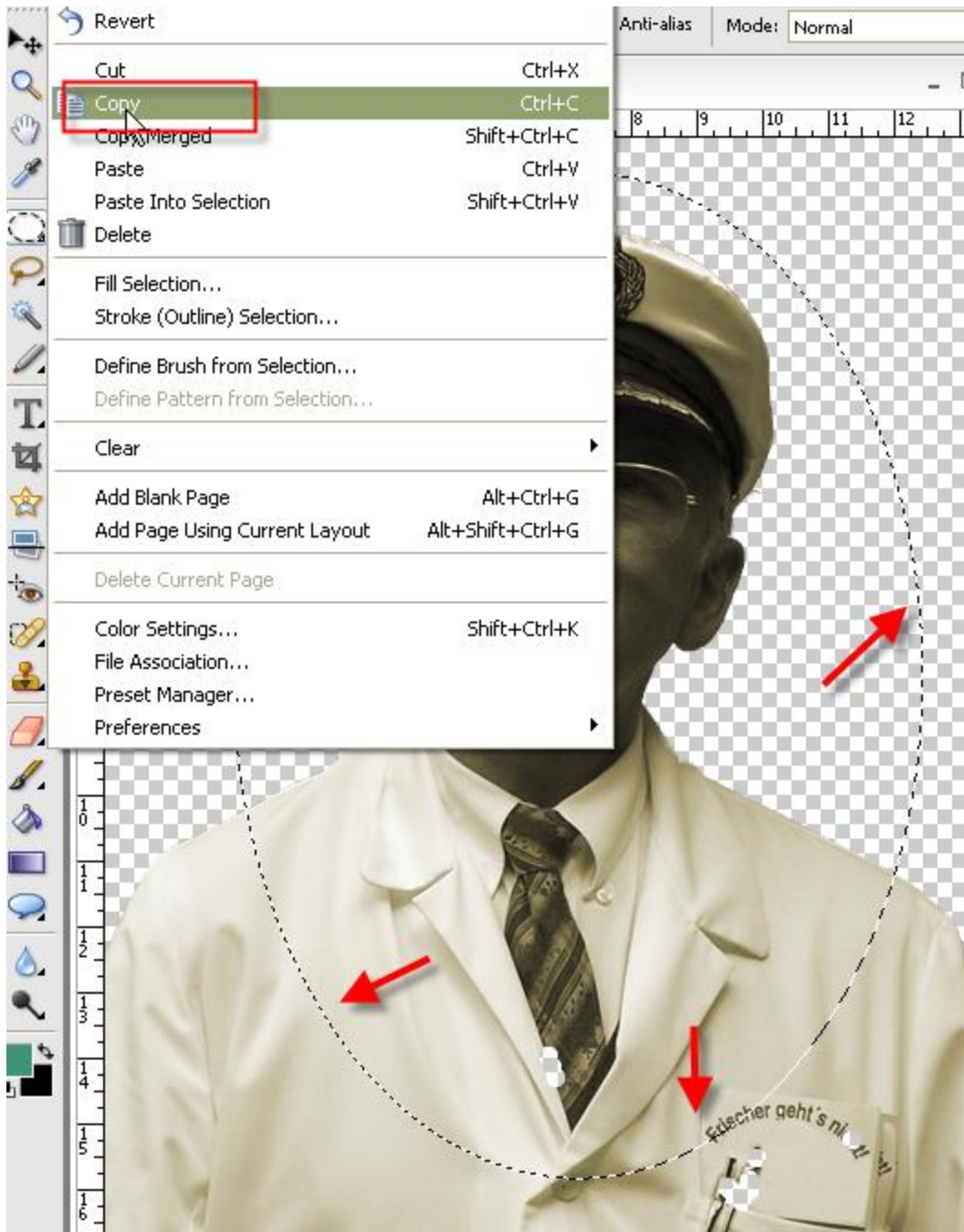
Add a tint – Enhance>Adjust Color>Hue and Saturation – check colorize:



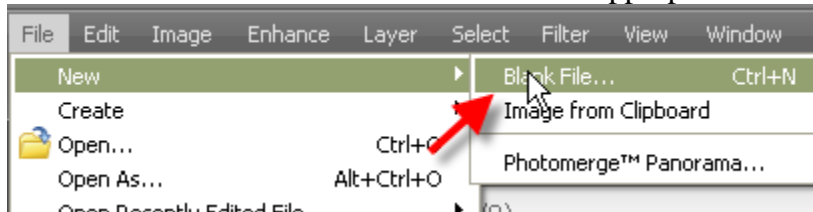
Choose elliptical marquee tool and Feather to 20 pixels:

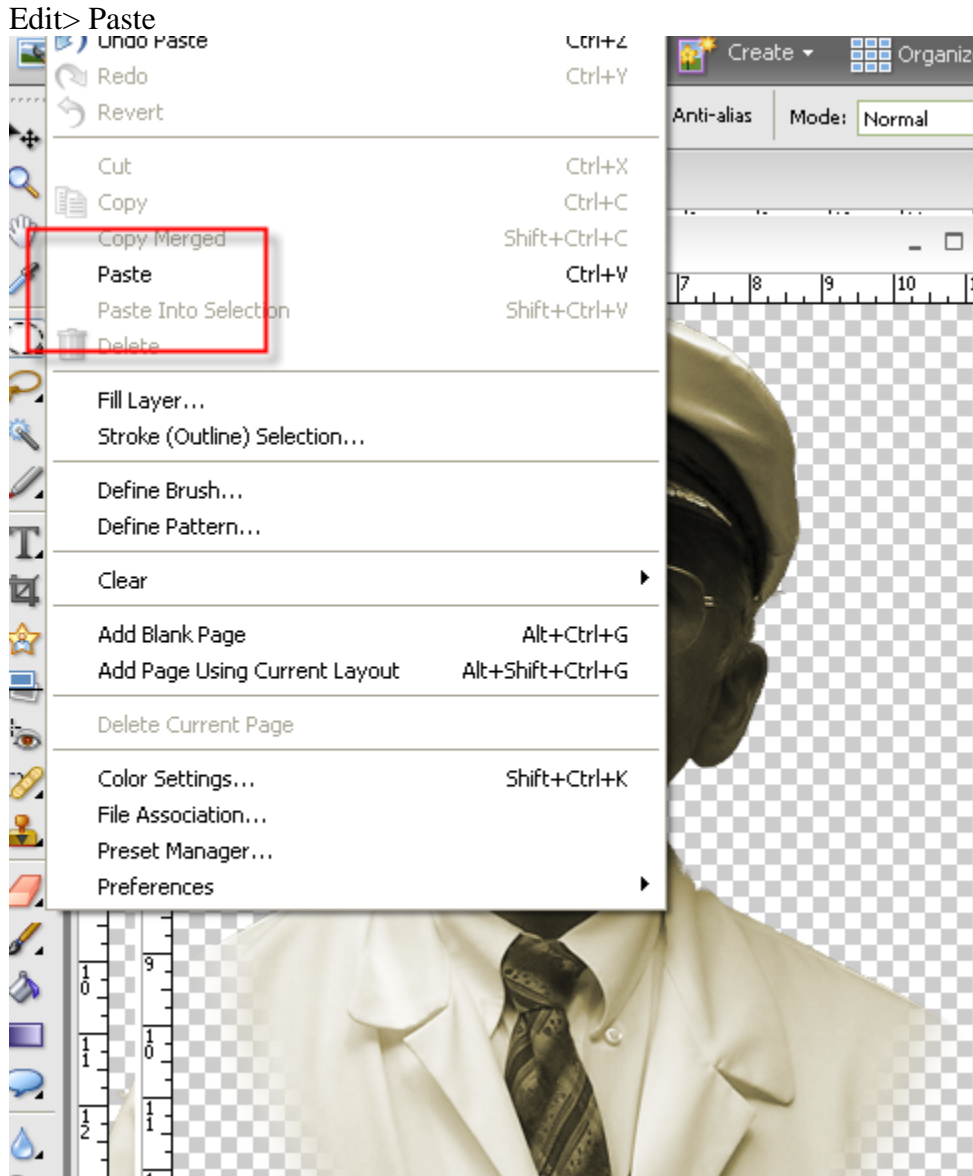


Make selection, Edit>Copy:

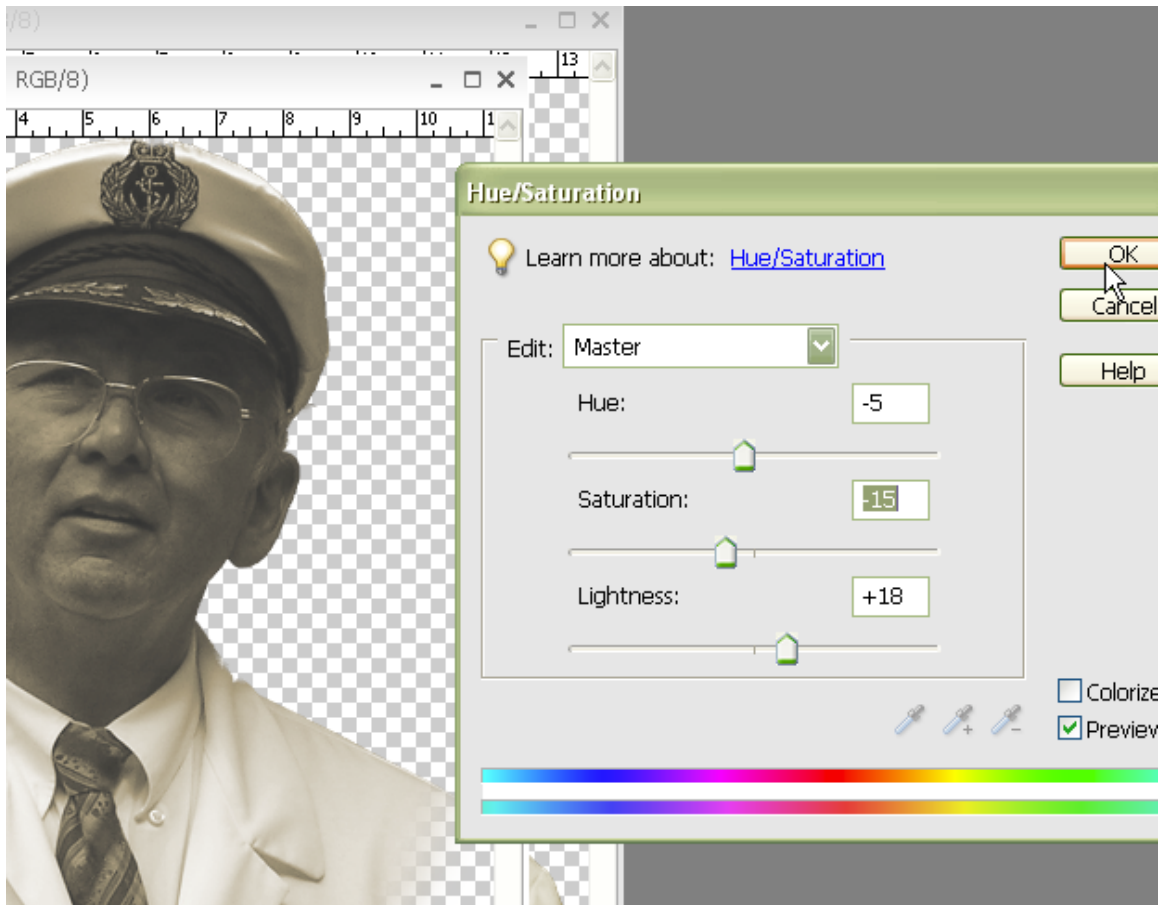


File>New Blank File – dimensions should be appropriate:

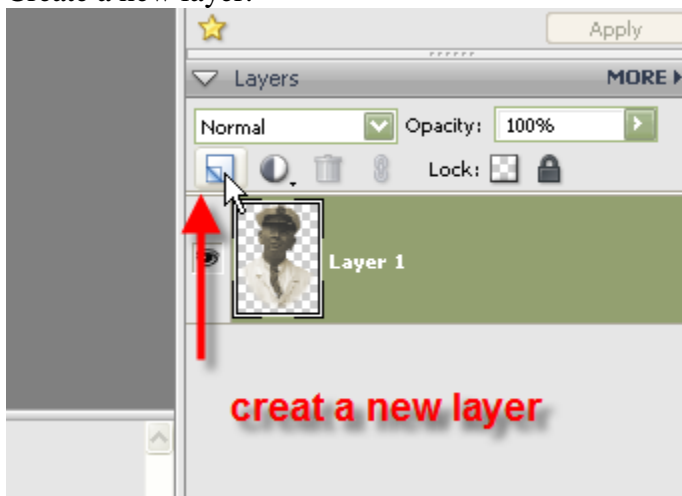




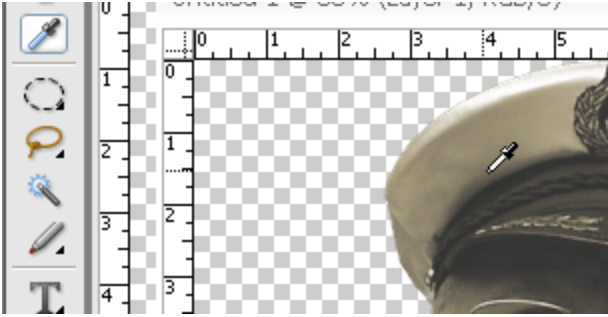
Adjust brightness, contrast, etc – correct tone.



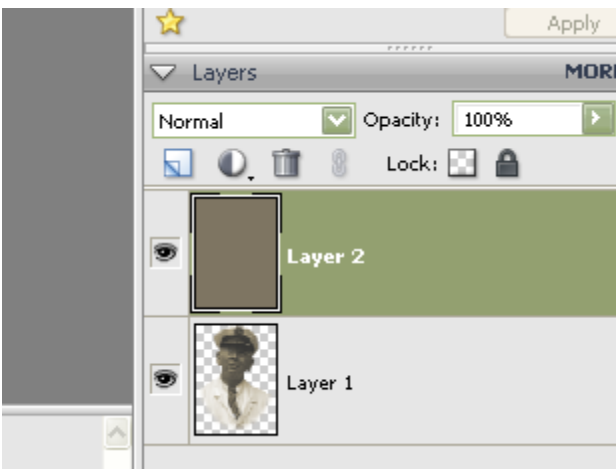
Create a new layer:



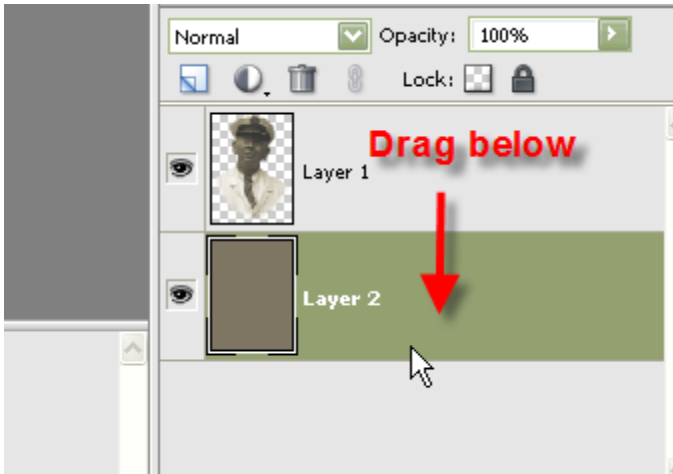
Use the eyedropper tool and the paintbucket to fill in the new layer with a matching color:



New layer is completely filled and cover up first layer:



Drag top layer below bottom layer:



Voila!
